



Introduction

On **09.12.2022**, a group of [Number] students from **Netaji Nagar College for Women**, **Kolkata-92**, accompanied by two faculty members, Dr. Soma Saha, Associate Professor of Economics and Dr. Bipul De, Associate Professor of Economics embarked on an educational tour to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) museum in Kolkata, located at 8 Council House Street the RBI Museum is just a short distance away from the RBI Kolkata regional office.

The *objective of the tour* was:

- 1. to provide students with a firsthand understanding of the history and evolution of the Indian banking system,
- 2. the role of the RBI in the Indian economy, and
- 3. the various aspects of money and currency.

The RBI Monetary Museum aims at documenting and preserving the heritage. The Museum proposes to put in place permanent, temporary and itinerant exhibits of the representative coinage of India, paper currency, gold bars as well as financial instruments and curiosities down the ages

The Museum Visit

The students were warmly welcomed by the museum staff and a brief orientation about the museum's layout and exhibits was given by Mr. Arindam Sen, Curator, RBI Museum, Kolkata.

The reception area of the museum

It contains a registration deck along with a small souvenir shop. The souvenir shop sells RBI memorabilia, many of which are made of shredded notes. The walls are decorated with shredded note design and the pillars contain a collage of discarded coins. A compilation of drawing shows the journey of Indian currency notes write from the making of the paper to the process of destruction.



Documentary on history of RBI

The visit to the RBI Museum starts with a small documentary. The 20 minutes documentary depicts the history of RBI along with a brief introduction to finance and banking.

Interactive session of our students with the officers from the main building was highly informative. Information regarding the job opportunities, specially for girls were truly encouraging for our students.

• Halls & Galleries

The museum is divided into several galleries, each showcasing a different aspect of the Indian banking system and its rich history.

- 1. Hall 1 Setting the Tone
- 2. Hall 2 The Central Hall : Gallery 1 History of Money, Gallery 2 Story of Gold, Gallery 3 Genesis of RBI.

The section on history of money continues through several displays which even includes models and video clips explaining more complex financial issues like gold standards.

• Printing section

Another interesting exhibit in the ground floor is a printing press, which is still in operation. Visitors in the RBI Museum can get a certificate with their names printed by the vintage press.





Conclusion

The educational tour to the RBI museum was a valuable learning experience for the students of Netaji Nagar College for Women, Kolkata-92. The students gained a deeper understanding of the Indian banking system, the role of the RBI, and the importance of money and currency in the economy. They also had the opportunity to see historical artifacts and interact with exhibits that brought the museum's collection to life.
































Session -II : Central Library, C. U. Time - 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM

The library of Calcutta University, established in 1857 will be now thrown open to public. Opening the library for public use will enable everyone to explore the unexplored territories in the field of arts, science and other literary fields and will create a positive impact on the College Street Campus.

Objective of the Group Visit:

- To expose students to the vast resources and services available at a renowned academic library of the **University of Calcutta**
- To familiarize students with different library sections, collections, and research methodologies.
- To inculcate a love for learning and research among students.





"Spread across ten floors of the Centenary building, the central library of Calcutta University houses more than seven lakh books, journals and research papers. Right from its inception, all the papers published by the university scholars are available here for public reading. Besides, a huge part of the library has been digitised and it gets over two lakh daily hits from across the world. Besides, the building also houses a Braille library, which has over 10 audio systems", The Times of India, September 10, 2021.

About the Group Visit:

The visit commenced with a library orientation session conducted by the librarian and library staff. Welcome address and briefing were given by Dr. Pratap Chandra Roy, Librarian and Dr. Supta Manna, Assistant Librarian of the University of Calcutta to our students. The interaction with librarians and faculty members sparked intellectual curiosity and encouraged students to delve deeper into their chosen field.




Concluding Observations:

AIM OF THE PROGRAMME

The Bengali filmmaker Mrinal Sen was the creator of socially conscious and rebellious films that challenged conventional mainstream philosophies. There's little in common between satyajit Ray Ritwik Ghatak and Mrinal Sen apart from the fact that they are all classic Bengali textbook auteurs who are highly respected and studies by cinephiles and students in film schools around the world. Ray's films are highly literate classical in spirit and reassure your faith in the human condition. By contrast ghatak's powerful films delved into themes of displacement and homeland and hopes of post partition Bengali society.

Enter Mrinal Sen one of the most in fluential Bengali Masters. Sen is the conjurer of politically bold and rebellious films that challenged conventional mainstream philosophies. His films explored the lives thoughts and beliefs of both the working class as wellas revolutionaries.

He rose to peaks of fame with his Calcutta trilogy in the early 70's interview, Calcutta 71 and padatik remain lining documents of the restless Calcutta of the 70's. His first film was released in 1955 and last in 2002 with his creativity peaking in the 1970s and early 1980s. He made 28 feature films including one for children to his credit of which 21 are in Bengali one each in Odia and five in Hindi.

Mrinal Sen has received various National and International Honors including eighteen Indian National Film Awards. The Government of India Honored him with the padma Bhushan. Sen was also awarded the dadasaheb phalke award the highest award for filmmakers in India.


